



Construction underway in Hollandale

Alliant Energy and MHTC team up to improve broadband access for community in southwest Wisconsin.

MADISON, Wis. (July 15, 2022) – It's official! Construction is underway in Hollandale, Wis. to bring up to 2-gig internet service to about 150 households and businesses in the area.

Earlier this week (July 10), Alliant Energy and MHTC representatives met with the Hollandale Village Clerk-Treasurer and Tri-State representatives on-site to view progress on the broadband project, which is expected to be operational September 2022.

Tri-State Directional Drilling, LLC is the FTTH contractor selected by MHTC to construct the project. Tri-State, established in 2011, is home to Hollandale WI, and prides itself in supporting local communities and is excited to improve rural broadband development in the area.

In mid-June, [Alliant Energy](#) and [Mt. Horeb Telephone Company](#) (MHTC) announced a [partnership that will bring a major connectivity boost to the rural community](#), located about 30 miles SW of Madison.
